From Rev'd Ann:

Two weeks ago, I attended an event at a large church in London, where the histo-

rian, Tom Holland, and rock musician, Nick Cave, were talking about faith to a packed auditorium of over 800 people.

Both men have come to faith through very personal experiences and spoke with refreshing honesty and without reference to any dogmas or the usual language of mainstream Christianity.

Tom Holland found himself in very dangerous territory on a visit to Iraq and came across an intact icon of the Angel Gabriel and Mary in a shelled outbuilding. As a historian of the ancient world, he adopted the mindset of ancient people who were open to the supernatural operating in the material world and reported the sensation of being brushed by the wings of the angel. Why shouldn't such experiences be real for people in this century, he asked.

Nick Cave has always had a real interest in the Christian religion, and the Bible especially, but his faith really developed into something that is profound and personal after the tragic death of his teenage son.



He spoke very movingly of a healing moment for himself and his wife in a small church near where they live, at the hands of a 'little old lady', and of how, when he now attends church, the liturgy both holds and envelops him but also allows his imagination and spirit to fly.

As I sat listening to these two very engaging speakers and looked at the rapt attention that they both received from their audience, I was heartened to recognise that God was working here. It is a relief to know that He does not wait for people who may think they are qualified or suitable to speak about faith. God uses whoever is at hand - whoever is open to his redeeming grace working in the world.

And that evening was full of grace. Both speakers conveyed a sense of wonder but also spoke with humility about their experiences. And both agreed that people of faith should not be embarrassed. If you are a believer, they said, then be a believer and don't ever apologise for it.

This got me thinking about how we can sometimes be unnecessarily reticent about speaking of our faith to those outside the church. It seems there is a growing interest in faith, in spirituality and religion and we cannot afford to hang back. We don't need to be dogmatic, argumentative or holier than thou, we just need to be authentic and speak with humility from our own experience.

As I said, God uses whoever is available and is open to his grace, so let us be just that. Who knows what will happen?
