## Orebeck Benefice News March 2024

From Rev'd Ann:

We all need stories. Stories are how we make sense of our lives. If a story is told well it will have the power to help us place ourselves within it and perhaps change our perceptions and ideas.

Stories have unexpected twists and turns. They find heroes and heroines in strange places; they reveal something about our human nature and can challenge the status quo.

We are hearing many, many stories in the news at present, particularly coming out of Gaza. Some will make us cry, some will make us angry and ask how this could be happening. However, we are also hearing stories of compassion and courage without which we would not be able to cope and might easily fall into despair.

In our Lent Course we are reading Mark's Gospel together. It really is a good story, full of action and excitement – I recommend it to you. But inevitably we know where it is leading - to Jerusalem, to the cross. As we read the Gospel, we will take this journey to the cross, alongside Jesus and his disciples, ending on Good Friday.

But, the good news is—and it is Good News— Good Friday is not the end of the story. Two days later, we celebrate Easter Sunday, and the resurrection into new life and new hope.

As we move into Spring and see signs of new life all around us, let us take hope and courage as our watchwords and not give in to despair. The greatest story ever told, that of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, tells us that there is **always** the possibility of new beginnings and new life.
