Dear Friends,

June is Jubilee month.....the Diamond Jubilee of Her Majesty the Queen.

Many people up and down the land will be celebrating her reign, and giving thanks for 60 years of service to the nation. From small village celebrations such as the 'Big Jubilee lunches' taking place, to the procession of boats down the Thames in London, we will celebrate her 60 Years on the throne.

Just before writing this letter I was given a faded and fragile copy of the Parish Magazine for Parham and Hacheston dated July, 1911. It, and others of similar age, were found amongst the papers of the late Ada Frost. In the Parish Magazine of July 1911, is an article entitled 'Parham: The Coronation'. (It must be that of George V.) I quote:

"The following arrangements have been made at Parham to celebrate the Coronation. A service will be held in the Church at 11.45. All will then adjourn to the ground, kindly lent by Mr. William Gray, where dinner will be served at 1.30 (all are requested to bring a plate, knife and fork, and a drinking vessel) The Sports Committee, consisting of Mr. H. R. Smith, chairman, Major Spinks, Messrs .W. Frost, R .Osler and L. Cordy, have arranged the following programme: (and I quote a sample, Rector).

- 1. 120 yds. race, boys 12 to 16 years.....1st prize...2s.
- 2. 3-legged boys race.....1st prize..1s.6d.
- 3. 100 yds. race, ladies over 40.... Prize...6 yds. calico.
- 4. Race, Old Age Pensioners, go as you please...1sr prize...2s.6d.
- 5. Tug –of-War (8 a side) married vs. single....prize...4 yds. of calico each.

Much the same will take place in Parham to celebrate the Queen's jubilee...

It is a remarkable testament to the Royal Family, and its place at the heart of the Nation, that such affection continues to be shown in this year of 2012, as it was in 1911.

I close with a prayer from the official Service of Thanksgiving for the Diamond Jubilee of Her Majesty the Queen:

'Beloved in Christ, We have come together to offer our worship and praise and thanksgiving, to hear and receive God's holy word, and to give thanks for the sixty year reign of Elizabeth our Queen. We pray for her continued health and wisdom that by the power of the Holy Spirit she may continue to give herself to the service of God. We commit ourselves afresh to serve our community and our nation that the earth be filled with God's justice, love and peace.'

KETTLEBURGH DIAMOND JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS

The Diamond Jubilee Committee has worked hard to secure funding for Kettleburgh's Diamond Jubilee celebration, so all the events planned for Kettleburgh's Big Jubilee Day on Sunday 3rd June will be free to every Kettleburgh resident.

The Committee would like to encourage the display of bunting along The Street and Church Road. If you would like to display bunting outside your house, please contact Deborah Bell (724743).

Plans for the day include: celebratory bell ringing; fun races for all ages; a magnificent lunch in our new large marquee with a choice of menu, including a Jubilee toast; the presentation of commemorative mugs and medals to all children of Kettleburgh. In the afternoon the Village Hall will be the setting for a traditional tea with a display of photographs and memorabilia, the stage area set up as a typical 'front room' of the 1950's and recordings playing of our older village folk recalling past times. The evening will begin with a special celebration service at St Andrews Church and later an informal dance at The Chequers featuring a well known local band playing for us in a marquee behind the pub.

Kettleburgh has been selected as one of 2012 sites for lighting a Jubilee Beacon on Monday 4th June. This will take place at Easton Green Cottage and there will be a lantern lit 'walking bus' leaving from the Chequers at 8p.m. The evening will include singing from a 40 piece local choir and the beacon will be lit at a specified allocated time between 10 and 10:30p.m. Tree cuttings for the Beacon are welcome anytime after 5th May. It is hoped that this range of events will give Kettleburgh folk a choice of ways to celebrate Queen Elizabeth's 60 magnificent years and that the weekend will be an occasion for all to remember.

As a lasting legacy it is also planned to plant a commemorative tree on the Village Green.

them for all their hard work and commitment that they give to the running of St Andrew's Church.

At the meeting, the Revd. Robin Alderson thanked Vickie Neilson whose term as Minute Secretary finished last year and Liz Marzetti who has also left the PCC. Their contributions have been much appreciated.

Established in 2007, Legacy Trust UK's mission is to support a wide range of innovative cultural and sporting activities for all, which celebrate the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games and which will leave a lasting legacy in communities throughout the United Kingdom. Community Games is now a national programme supported by the Legacy Trust and the Cabinet Office through Big Society funding. Community Games provide a wonderful and unique opportunity for communities from all backgrounds right across the country to come together and celebrate the 2012 Games and enable thousands of people to experience and create their own Olympic or Paralympic moment.

Local communities can organise their Games in a way that celebrates the uniqueness of their community. Events can take place indoors or outdoors, in a variety of settings from parks to community centres, and will combine sporting and cultural elements attracting a cross

generational audience. Some communities may focus on contests to give the event a competitive element whilst others may want to focus on giving people the opportunity to try something new, from archery to climbing.

In Suffolk we have a grant available for up to £500 for groups to run Community Games events before the end of September 2012. Volunteers must be central to the delivery of Community Games events. Training and support packages are also available.

Whooping Cough and measles

The Health Protection Agency has issued a warning to parents that there has been an outbreak of whooping cough in the local area. We are also aware of a rise in the incidence of measles – this is a nasty illness that can lead to deafness in children and is potentially fatal. Please check that your child has up to date vaccinations. If you are in any doubt, please contact one of our Practice Nurses who will be able to advise you.

If you are collecting medications from Ipswich Hospital (or have medications sent to you by the hospital) please can you let us know. It is important that we have a full list of your medications to prevent us prescribing something for you which might be 'contraindicated'.
