The Clergy Letter

Dear Friends

At the end of this month , on October $26^{th}\,$ we have a Sunday which the Church in many places observes as Bible Sunday

So a few words about the bible and reading it seemed needed. The Bible is not so much just a 'best seller' and it is believe it or not! . The Holy Bible is more than a book it is a library containing 26 book in the Old Testament, and 27 more in the New Testament which is where we find the good stories about the life and works of Jesus. And every line in the Scriptures it contains are intended to help us know God, and live lives according to his rules, though to be fair some are more readily readable and understandable than other, so it's not a book to be read from cover to cover at one go, rather one to be dipped into.

And among the many genres which it uses to convey this message are poetry, biography, history, fiction, and law. Sometimes it's obvious which style is being used: the Psalms are poetry, the parables of Jesus are fiction. At other times things are not so clear , and it really doesn't matter, which we believe a particular passage is, provided we are willing to dig below the surface, and find the out what spiritual message God is trying to convey to us through the specific passage we are reading at the time. Reading, and digesting it, then letting our hearts hold fast to the words so that we might get wisdom and insight from the words God sent to us.

And there is a Collect (a special prayer) for this last Sunday of October which sums up the importance of why we read our bibles whether we do it daily, or only occasionally, randomly or by using a more structured method, or even if we only hear it read when in Church.

"Blessed Lord, who caused all holy Scriptures to be written for our learning: help us so to hear them, to read, mark, learn and inwardly digest them that, through patience, and the comfort of your holy word, we may embrace and forever hold fast the hope of everlasting life, which you have given us in our Saviour Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever."

It is hoped that on the completion of this course you will be able to use your new skills to record other airfield buildings.
