Building Recording Techniques



Have you always had an interest in archaeology? Want to learn new skills and help out the Eighth in the East project? Live close to Parham Airfield? We want to hear from vou!

On Saturday 8th November we will be running a free day-long course providing an introduction to recording your local airfield. This course will be held at 390th Bomb Group Museum at Parham Airfield from 11am until around 4pm.

The morning will be spent at the museum learning how to conduct a building survey, followed by an afternoon where you can test your new recording skills and exploring airfield buildings nearby. It is hoped that on the completion of this course you will be able to use your new skills to record other airfield buildings.

No previous experience is necessary! We will provide all the equipment you will need to carry out the survey, as well as explaining how to fill in one of our recording forms.
