Be ready on The Street from 6.00 pm to make sure you don't miss him.





#### Marlesford Old School Fund – Trustees invited

After the village school closed in 1965, the Community Council was set up to raise the £1,000 to buy the buildings to be used as the Community Centre. The County Council invested the money, and the income generated is used to award small grants to village children and young adults to help further their education. Currently, the money is invested in COIF Charities Ethical Investment Fund with a bid market value of £26,500 (June 2022). Although the investment has taken a hit this year, we are still able to make awards to all applicants making valid applications.

### **Hugh Chilvers Obituary**

Hugh Chilvers was a caring husband to his wife Judy, father to Nadine Rickards and Alison Parnell, grandfather to Dan and Catherine Rickards and William Bramwell, and a good friend. He passed away suddenly on 12 <sup>th</sup> September, 2022, aged 84, at his home in Holt Norfolk.



A local lad who grew up in Campsea Ashe Hugh was laid to rest at St John the Baptist Church, Campsea Ashe on the 20<sup>th</sup> October. member of the St John the Baptist Church choir and led the procession up the aisle at church services carrying the cross. Despite moving away and travelling as a pilot with the RAF he always wanted to come back home to be with his first wife, Pat, and family. His brother Adrian, parents Sidney and Norrie Chilvers and maternal grandparents William and Margaret Cairns are all buried at the church.

Hugh was born in Melton, Woodbridge on 10 October 1937. He lived with his parents, Sidney and Norrie Chilvers at Shrubbery Farm, Campsea Ashe until December 1949 when they had to move out of the farm. William Cairns (maternal grandfather) was farm Bailiff which was a role his father Sidney took on when William died. The farm belonged to Viscount Ullswater and formed part of his estate. When Lord Ullswater died in March 1949 the estate farms were put up for sale and Hugh's parents moved out. Sidney then bought a house from the Ullswater Estate in Tunstall which was his home village. He had previously lived at Church Farm in Tunstall with his parents. This farm was also part of Lord Ullswater's Estate.

Hugh went to the village school in Campsea Ashe from ages 5 - 11. He passed the 11+ exam and went onto Woodbridge Grammar School from September 1949 to December 1954. Whilst there he had the opportunity to go gliding at Martlesham, even going solo. A taste of his career to come.

After leaving Woodbridge School Hugh joined the RAF, enlisting in June 1955 as an Aircraft Engine Trade Assistant. After training he was posted to RAF Marham to work as an Engine Mechanic on Canberra Bomber on 115 Squadron. He then joined 148 Squadron, also at RAF Marham, which had been formed with the first nuclear V-Bomber named the Valiant. Seeing his ability the Squadron Commander offered Hugh the opportunity to apply for Aircrew in 1961 and following a selection assessment Hugh was offered a Commission as an Officer.



It was also in 1961 that Hugh went on holiday to Butlins at Pwllheli with friends and met his future wife, Florence Patricia Anne Lewis. She lived with her parents in Liverpool. They were engaged Christmas 1962 and married on 10th October 1964.

In 1964 Hugh was posted to RAF Scampton 83 Squadron, Vulcan B2 having completed his co-pilot training. In 1966 he then went on to pass the selection procedure to captain his own crew and following successful completion of the necessary training went back to RAF Scampton with his crew to No 27 Squadron to fly Vulcan B2's again. This of course was at the height of the Cold War. If they had ever taken off in anger, they did not have the range to get back again to British soil.

Following a posting in 1969 to RAF Linton to undertake Flying Instructor training following Hugh was then posted back to RAF Scampton as an Instructor on Vulcan aircraft. His great forte as a pilot was instrument flying – he could fly in almost any weather conditions

After further training Hugh was posted in 1980 to RAF Wyton to No 51 Squadron, a signals intelligence squadron, flying Nimrod R1 aircraft. One night the authorities wanted to know about something going on somewhere, so he took off in total pea soup fog — not many could have done that. On another, he flew towards Libya with Gaddaffi's fighters trying to persuade him not to.

In 1983 there was a posting to RAF Waddington to fly the trials on the Airbourne Early Warning Nimrod with the aim of introducing the aircraft to RAF service. The project proved to be hugely complex and expensive as a result of the difficulties of producing new radar and computer systems and integrating them successfully into the Nimrod airframe. Hugh spent all of his time flying up and down with boffins in the back trying to make it all work. There was much coverage of this, and if you saw it on the TV news, it was usually Hugh piloting the plane. The trails led to the aircraft failing to meet the required specification and it was scrapped in 1986.

After his first wife, Pat, died in 1987 Hugh requested a posting to RAF Honington to be near to his family home at the time. Here he worked as a Flight Simulator Instructor for the Tornado aircraft. Following the move of the Tornado aircraft to RAF Lossiemouth Hugh secured work at RAF Coltishall as a Flight Simulator Instructor on the Jaguar aircraft starting in 1994. He remained working there until he retired in October 2000.



Hugh met his second wife Judy Verkerk in 1996 and they were married in 2001. After some time living at Felmingham they moved to Holt in 2012 where they spent many happy years together.

In recent years Hugh could be found sharing stories and knowledge as a volunteer showing visitors around the cockpit of the Vulcan at the City of Norwich Aviation Museum.

Hugh's RAF service was honoured at his funeral by a bugler from the RAF sounding the Last Post, as well as a guard of honour and standard bearers from the Royal Airforce Association in attendance.

Hugh was much loved by his friends, his wife Judy, his daughters and grandchildren. The tributes by family and friends at his funeral were testament to what a great man he was.













Last year Ipswich churches launched a Christmas campaign called Inspiring Angels and this year Campsea Ashe Church is joining in the campaign. From the 17th to 31st December hundreds of knitted and paper Angels will be decorating the Church as part of the Christmas festival.

Angels are a symbol of love, of presence, pointing the way to the moment it all changed, when God came in the person of Jesus to be with us in the world, to share in love and pain alongside us. Angels appeared to tell us about the birth of a baby in a manger. Angels sang, bursting with joy, to some shepherds, and told them, "Go and see!"

Our Church is always open, so come and see the Angels whenever you like. They will add to the enjoyment of the Candlelit Carol Service so if you can join us then for what is always a special occasion that really starts the Christmas festivities in the best possible way.

It is vital that our Government policies are fit for purpose and it's important to hear the impact that any changes will have on the ground for our local food producers.

I will always do my very best to support Suffolk's farmers and food producers and I will continue to speak with Ministers to make sure that their voices are heard in Parliament. The effects of the ongoing Avian Influenza outbreak Suffolk are of significant concern and this is why I have been pressing Government Ministers to better support this important sector. it is essential that the Government continue to consider the impact that these issues have on our farmers, food producers, retailers and ultimately the consumer.



Agriculture, food and drink remain central to our local economy with more than one in seven jobs in Suffolk having some link to food production. We really are incredibly lucky to have such wonderful farmers and food producers on our doorstep and in the run up to Christmas, like you, I will be supporting them by buying local produce and gifts.
