

BRANDESTON FOOD BANK

An initiative to help those in need in East Suffolk during these difficult times has been suggested by members of All Saints' Church and other village groups.

From the first week of February (1st to 8th) we will be collecting using a large storage box at Mary and Paul Baker's house in Mill Lane. This will be positioned on their front drive. Donations of food items of a non-perishable nature would be most gratefully received. Other items such toiletries would also be welcomed. This location was chosen as being central and easily accessible. We also intend to take the collection box to the village hall on Thursday mornings. This pattern of the first week in the month will then be repeated for six months initially and continue as required.

Currently the most appropriate route of distribution would be the Salvation Army in Woodbridge as they run a system with many villages feeding into them. We do have kind volunteers to manage our end.

We detail below a possible route into help and support that is currently operating, including access to financial help and food banks.

If you know anyone who may need help, they can approach Citizens' Advice on a free and confidential phone number – 0808 2082138. The Citizens' Advice Service can then put people in touch with food banks and issue vouchers.

JOHN HARGREAVES (12th October 1932 - 20th December 2022)

John's funeral took place on 9th January 2023 at Easton church. During the service members of his family and close friends paid tribute to John and all that he had achieved in his life.

Born in 1932, John was a proud Yorkshireman. He had two sisters and as a schoolboy he enjoyed growing vegetables (that remained a life-long interest) and helping on a local farm. He went to grammar school where he played football for his school and then his county. He also played for his university of Bangor where he took an honours degree in agriculture.

In 1955 he was called up for the RAF where he did officer training and became a Mess Officer. When he left the RAF in 1956 he joined Fisons. He also joined the Young Farmers where he met Margaret and they were married in 1958. They moved to Lincoln and their daughters Susan and Sarah were born there.

With John's promotion in 1970 the family moved to Easton. In 1983 he became Secretary of the Suffolk Show and ran the annual event until retiring after the 1994 show. During that time he hosted members of the Royal Family including Princess Diana in 1986. He also hosted Prince Charles, now King Charles, at an agricultural show in Debenham where he introduced him to Suffolk horses. He was a leading figure in the Suffolk Horse Society and also a past president of the Framlingham Horse Show.

John was also a committed Freemason and was especially active in their charitable work both nationally and internationally.

He was a proud grandfather and great-grandfather. His children and grandchildren particularly enjoyed stories he made up for them.

We send Margaret and all the family our sincere sympathies and best wishes. May John rest in peace.

A Tribute to Daphne Culpan -6th October1932 - 7th December 2022

Parham Church was full on Tuesday 10th January when Daphne was brought home to her final resting place to be with George in the churchyard. It was a miserably wet day but the church was full and resplendent with spring flowers, beautifully arranged by her village friends. Even the snowdrops and winter anemones were blooming at the church door. The service was conducted by Deirdre Parmenter who had known Daphne for over 30 years. As part of the service the benefice choir reassembled and gave a rendition of The Lord's Prayer, which had been arranged by George himself. What an interesting and particularly sporting life Daphne had had with her two older brothers and twin sister, Dell. Daphne became a County Swimmer for Kent whilst still at school. Her hand to eye co-ordination must have been extremely good as well, because she excelled in Badminton and played for Sussex and then added tennis, golf and table tennis as the years went by and which she continued to play here in Suffolk. While studying for her BSc in Horticulture at Wye College she first met George, their paths divided and she went on to become a specialist in entomology working for Rentokil. Later on, they met again and in 1968 they married and set up their family home in Bedfordshire with George's sons, Richard, Doug and Jeff. They threw themselves into village life there before moving to Suffolk in 1986, supposedly to retire. It didn't take long however, before they were as busy as ever at the centre of village activities in Parham too. Daphne became secretary of the PCC, helped organise the Parham Rendezvous and joint edited the Parish Magazine with George. They helped with many other social functions in the village and could always be relied on to provide refreshments and plants. They joined the church choir and were always the first to welcome newcomers. We will all have particular memories of Daphne and I shall never forget her lively, welcoming smile and her inherent interest in nature around her, her love of dogs and willingness to pass on her amazing plant knowledge. I enjoyed a fair few walks with Daphne and Misty, who was her faithful companion for many years, particularly after George had died. Kaye Dawe

High Academic Success

Tom Cox developed an interest in history while at primary school and used to go out in the Marlesford fielsds with his dad and their metal detectors. After finishing at Thomas Mills, Tom went off to the UEA to read history. He completed his first degree with flying honours and then began a MA, which he has recently completed.

Tom has been given 2 awards for his Masters degree - the Larry Butler prize awarded for the best dissertation by an MA student and secondly for a distinguished performance by MA student. The following comes from the academic assessment of Tom's dissertation:

"This is an exceptional piece of work that is deserving of an exceptional mark. The subject matter is vast - regional variation and its origins are perhaps the most-written about subjects in landscape history, yet the candidate clearly commands the historiography and is happy to confirm and challenge the received wisdom at every turn. Moreover, it does so via innovative and comprehensive use of HER* and especially PAS* material, the latter a seriously under-exploited resource. The use of GIS* is flawless. To cap all this, the candidate manages to organise and marshal his data into a well-written and clear narrative. It is difficult to add any more to this, other than to say that this is one of the best dissertations the MA in Landscape History has seen for a considerable time.

In terms of a mark, an excellent dissertation, carefully researched, well written and well presented and which makes several interesting and highly original points will naturally receive a mark in the distinction range. The question here is how high and here it is worth noting that the section on settlements and parish boundaries in particular really should be published as it is a significant contribution to scholarship. As a piece of work part of which merits publication, this would push the mark into those parts of the distinction range rarely reached."
